

FR. NIKON ANSWERS YOUR QUESTIONS

Question: Is it a sin to fear contracting coronavirus when kissing icons? Is it allowed to clean the icons before and after kissing them?

Answer: In light of the current situation, disinfection facilities in the church are necessary. As for wiping the icons, it is not only possible to do this, but needs to be done constantly, not only during the coronavirus. Of course, we always try to keep holy icons clean, and church attendants periodically wipe them. Now, in this difficult time, we do it much more often and allow the opportunity to just bow to the icons and not kiss - And there is nothing shameful in that, especially during the spread of infection. We may reverently wipe the image to cleanse the icon. The main thing is to do it with heart; if we do it with fear and panic, then there is nothing good and useful for our soul in this (on the contrary, the lack of hope is destructive), but if we do it with reverence and trust in The Lord, modestly and without making it a show, but at the same time with a wise fear for health, this is correct and sincere.

Ascension of The Lord (May 28)

After Resurrection, for forty days, our Lord Jesus Christ appeared to the apostles more than once, instructing them in the foundations of building the Church and spreading the true faith. On the fortieth day, when the last such phenomenon took place, The Lord, having promised the disciples that The Holy Spirit would soon be sent to the world, led the disciples out of Jerusalem to the Mount of Olives on the way to Bethany and, blessing them, began to ascend to heaven, "and the cloud took him from their sight" [Acts. 1, 9]

Ascension completed the earthly ministry of the Son of God. Having conquered death, He elevated human nature to the

Throne of God the Father, in the mountain cloisters, thereby preparing man's nature for the acceptance of the Holy Spirit.

MEMBERS RECOMMEND

Our parishioner Elena Atchley, a medical professional, shares the recommendations of one doctor (Dr. Seheult), who provides a balanced and competent video regarding all the latest research and publications about COVID-19. Dr. Seheult has already posted at least 60 such videos dedicated to this issue. In particular, in the video below, the doctor gives recommendations on how to strengthen our immune system.

These recommendations in no way harm human health, but can to one degree or another help to strengthen our immunity. Many medical professionals agree that the most powerful weapon against this virus is our immune system. The virus tries to turn off the first line of defense of our immune system - it strongly suppresses lymphocytes. In general, scientists and doctors around the world have not found a cure for this virus, although many studies are currently being conducted and tests of about 30 drugs: with fragmentary, intermediate and still incomplete studies. But by and large, today we have the following picture: if a person's immunity did not cope with the virus on their own, then in the hospital, the patient can only receive supportive treatment, so very high mortality rates are observed in intensive care units.

Fortunately, 80% of the population suffers from this infection in a mild form. This virus has an amazing selectivity, even in families; with very close contact, not all family members become ill. And many do not even suspect that they are or have been ill. By the grace of God, these people's immunity worked 100%.
